Reaching the Conference

Amsterdam Law School


Nieuwe Achtergracht 166, Amsterdam Roeterseiland Campus Building A, 3rd floor

By Public Transport

- From Schiphol Airport: There are regular train connections going directly from Schiphol Airport to Amsterdam city centre. Going straight from the airport to Amsterdam Law School? Take the Sprinter train towards Utrecht Centraal and get out at 'Amsterdam Rai' station (the 2nd stop). Change to metro 51 towards 'Centraal Station' and get off at Weesperplein (the 5th stop)
- From Rotterdam Airport: Take Bus 33 direction 'Overschie', and get off at 'Bentinckplein'. From there it is a 6-minute walk to Rotterdam Central Station. There, catch an Intercity to Amsterdam Centraal, they are regular. Coming straight to the Amsterdam Law School? Take metro 51, 53 or 54 from Amsterdam Central to Station 'Weesperplein' (the 3rd stop)
- From Central Station: Take metro 51 (towards Isolatorweg), metro 53 (towards Gaasperplas) or metro 54 (towards Gein) and get off at 'Weesperplein' (the 3rd stop)
- From Amstel Station: Take metro 51, 52 or 53 (towards Central station) and get off at 'Weesperplein' (the 2nd stop)

From Metro Station 'Weesperplein' (walking)

• Go east on the Sarphatistraat. Take the first street to your left: Roetersstraat. Turn right directly after you pass Lebkov (coffeeplace). After you pass the Law Hub on your right-hand side, take the main entrance on the right. Once you've entered the building, turn to the left to building C. Staff members will guide you to the registration table for the conference.

Restaurant 'A Beautiful Mess' Oosterdokskade 227 1011 DL Amsterdam

- From the Amsterdam Law School: Walk ca. 5 mintues to 'Weesperplein' metro station. Take either metro 51 (towards centraal station), 53 (towards centraal station) or 54 (towards centraal station) and get off at 'Central Station'
- From Central Station: It is an 11 to 12 minutes walk. Turn right at the metro stop and walk towards the Eastern Docks. You will pass landmarks such as the floating restaurant 'Sea Palace' (on your right) or the Amsterdam Public Library (OBA) on your left

• From the Amsterdam Law School: It is an 8 to 9 minutes walk. Once you exit the law school turn left and follow the canal in a straight line. Once you reach the Amstel River, turn right and walk another 1 to 2 minutes until you reach Carré



Using Public Transport in Amsterdam

- **OVPay:** You can easily check-in and out of public transport with your debit or credit card. Simply hold your card against the card reader on the bus, tram, metro or at the check-in portals at the train station. The system will beep once you have checked in correctly. Be sure to check out with the same card at your destination
- **Public transport chip card (OV-Chipkaart):** If you're staying in Amsterdam for longer, it's also possible to get a rechargeable 'OV-Chipkaart' to check in and out of public transport. The cards are available at GVB ticket machines, GVB Tickets & Info offices, and select newsstands and supermarkets.
- **24hr/Multi-day ticket:** It is also an option to purchase a 24h or multi-day ticket. This kind of ticket provides you with unlimited travel on all public transport routes (excluding trains), regardless of distance, both day and night. The ticket becomes valid the first time you check in. This product is available at the AKO at Schiphol Airport, the GVB app, or at GVB ticket vending machines.

Europe's Largest Flea Market

The largest flea market in Europe is **Ijhallen** in Amsterdam Noord. It will take place on 20 – 21 July. To get there, take the ferry to 'NDSM-werf' from Central Station (ferry leaves from the IJ-zijde of the station and is free of charge). A ticket to the market costs €6,- and can be bought at the entrance. Make sure to bring some cash!

Fancy a Swim?

July can be hot in Amsterdam. There are various locations in and around the city to swim and relax by the water.

Strand Zandvoort

Located ca. 30 minutes by train from Central Station. Trains are every 30 minutes from Platform 1 at Amsterdam Central, direction 'Zandvoort', get off at the last stop. From there it is a 5 minute walk to reach the beach.

Strand IJburg

It is a 20 minute Tram Ride from Amsterdam Central Station. Take Tram 26 destination 'Ijburg' and get off at the last stop. From there it is a 10 to 20 minute walk to the beach.
